

Car Parking

Track and Trace

As a school, we are still the first point of call for any track and trace queries for our pupils. I have attached a separate letter to this newsletter explaining the process. It is important to note that from December 24th onwards, any queries must go through the normal NHS track and trace systems. The school email will not be checked again until the start of the Spring term.

School reopening

It is our intention that we will fully reopen on Tuesday, 5th January 2021 to all of our pupils as normal. The same procedures for coming into school will apply, with the same times and expectations of social distancing. However, we are uncertain as to how the relaxed measures advised by the Government will affect local regulations in the New Year. Decisions on school opening will be based on this advice and will be made on Monday, 4th January. There will be no decisions made before this date, so please do not expect correspondence from school before this time. We will also not be checking emails before this date so please do not be offended if we do not reply immediately.
