Dear Parents

As we approach another Autumnal weekend, under our second National lockdown of 2020, I wanted to wish you all the very best for this weekend whatever you are planning to do. Although it continues to be difficult for all of us, I know our special community will look after each other. There are many things I need to communicate with you, so here goes!

Bishop Chadwick Catholic Education Trust (BCCET)

Following consultation with everyone involved in our school, Governors agreed that we will join BCCET on Tuesday, 1st December. From that date, we will be known as **St Joseph's Catholic Primary School**. Initially you should see very little change around school. As the year goes on, there may be some things that are different, such as a different logo on the uniform, but you will be informed of these changes when they are due to take place. On the same date, St Aloysius Infant & Junior School will also convert, with St Bede's Primary and Ss Peter and Paul's Primary Schools in South Shields consulting to convert at Easter 2021. This is an exciting time to be part of Catholic education in the North East and will present us with many opportunities.

Nursery & Reception places

If you have a child who is due to begin Reception in September 2021, application packs have been sent by South Tyneside Council. The closing date for applications to Reception is January 15th 2021. If you know of families who are looking for places for their child in September, I know I can rely on you to 'spread the word' about our lovely school! We have produced a new prospectus which is available on our website, while our current Nursery parents will receive a shiny new paper copy!

If you would like your child to attend our Nursery, or know of a family who would like this, application forms and prospectuses are available from the office. Usually we would be happy to show prospective parents around our school but with current restrictions, we are unable to do this. As a result, we have asked a local film company to make a promotional video sharing the excellence of St Joseph's. This will be available soon!

Christmas Organisation

It's (nearly) the most wonderful time of the year! As I mentioned last week, we are unable to offer the usual celebrations this year, but we are trying to make Christmas as meaningful and enjoyable as possible. Information regarding parties, Nativities etc was shared in last week's letter, which is available on our school website, but we have also agreed to a couple of extras!

- **Christmas baubles** - as parents and the community will not be able to see our lovely school Christmas decorations, we are going to bring them outside! We will be 'decorating' our school fence outside Year 5 and invite our school community to help us. Please feel free to add a bauble to our decorations. We ask that you add them when you drop your child in the mornings as this is usually the quietest time of the day. We also have outdoor baubles available for £1 which you can decorate with your child's name if you wish.

Google Classroom

We are now using Google Classroom through the school for both homework and remote learning. The expectation is that children access the classroom to complete their homework or reading consistently, as they would with paper versions. We do realise that you are missing the normal opportunities of seeing your child in their class so we are currently developing our 'Window into' sections which, as the title suggests, will give you a window into what your child is doing. This has been piloted by Reception with very positive feedback.
