Dear Parents/Carers,

You will be aware from media coverage that teaching members of the National Education Union (NEU) declared strike action last month, with the strikes taking place on **1st and 28th February, and the 15th and 16th March 2023**. The strike is happening as a result of a national dispute between the union and the government over pay and funding, and not because of any issues in school or in the Trust.

As you may be aware, on the first day of action across South Tyneside, schools that have very few NEU members were able to be open to all pupils, some that have a relatively small number were open to a reduced number of year groups and some, like us, have a significant proportion and so had to close most year groups. South Tyneside headteachers are expecting a similar pattern for 15th and 16th March 2023.

I will confirm these arrangements on Tuesday 14th March, in case anything changes between now and then.

Unfortunately, if the strike does go ahead, we will have to ask the following year groups to **stay at home** as we have insufficient staffing levels due to the strike action:

Nursery, Year 1, Year 2, Year 3, Year 4, Year 5, Year 6

This is not a decision we take lightly but the safety of our pupils is paramount.

Parents who have already requested a packed lunch will be able to collect it from the office from 11am. If you no longer require the packed lunch, please inform the office, as there were lunches that were not collected and wasted last time.

I understand that this situation may be frustrating and apologise for any potential disruption caused. Thank you for your support and understanding.

School will be open as normal following the strike action.
